

The "electoral cycle" approach has been endorsed at policy level by the major electoral assistance providers

It significantly contributed to a policy shift in the way electoral assistance is designed and the way in which related support project are formulated and implemented

This shift entailed moving the focus of support from the election day to the entire process that precedes and follows an election

substantial work still remains to be done to further influence electoral assistance policy, particularly at a regional level, and in terms of policy adoption and actual implementation at a national level




#### Background

Welcome to the eLearning Course on Effective Electoral Assistance.

This eLearning Course is the result of sustained cooperation efforts undertaken over the last years by the European Commission, the United Nations Development Programme and International Institute for Democracy Electoral Assistance (International IDEA) in the field of electoral assistance. The Course has been created on the basis of the content and the structure of the Training Manual of the "Joint Training on Effective Electoral Assistance", a global training initiative developed and launched by the three institutions.

As already for the Training Manual, the eLearning Course on Effective Electoral Assistance primarily draws on the content of the following four core sources:

- the EC Methodological Guide on Electoral Assistance;
- the UNDP Electoral Assistance Implementation Guide;
- International IDEA's Handbook on Electoral Management Design; and
- the ACE Focus on Effective Electoral Assistance.

#### Background

More in particular, the MoU focuses on democratic governance (including elections, parliament and governance indicators), conflict prevention and post-conflict reconstruction setting the conditions for regular policy dialogue, enhanced programme collaboration at all levels.

Additional progress was achieved in 2006, when EuropeAid Director General, Koos Richelle, and the UNDP Associate Administrator, Ad Melkert, signed the EC/UNDP "**Operational Guidelines for the Implementation** of Electoral Assistance Programmes and Projects". These Guidelines outline a number of practical measures for further strengthening and supporting the already established partnership and cooperation between the EC and the UNDP in the field of electoral assistance.

The EC-UNDP Partnership represented a breakthrough both for its scope and for the type and level of the initiatives involved, which are all geared towards ensuring a more sustainable and effective electoral assistance.

#### Policy and strategic framework: UN and UNDP

According to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, elections are to be considered a human right:

"...the will of the people shall be the basis of the authority of government; this will shall be expressed in periodic and genuine elections..." (Art 21 Universal Declaration of Human Rights)

UN electoral assistance has two primary goals:

- To assist member states in their efforts to hold credible and legitimate elections in accordance with electoral standards in international and regional instruments
- To contribute to building, in the recipient country, a sustainable institutional capacity to organise democratic elections that are genuine and periodic and have the full confidence of the contending parties and the electorate



The primary entry point for UNDP to advance these goals is by either fostering the creation of a

strong, professional and independent Election Management Body (EMB) and related public institutions, or by enhancing the independence and credibility of such institutions if they already exist.

#### Policy and Strategic Framework & Criteria

Post-conflict elections often take place in countries where the UN has either a peacekeeping or a political mission. Under these circumstances, there is normally a Security Council resolution that gives the mission the mandate to lead or coordinate electoral assistance under the guidance of EAD/DPA. UNDP works in close collaboration with EAD/DPA in supporting the electoral component of the UN mission according to an agreed division of labour. UNDP support could include traditional technical electoral assistance to the electoral authorities, management of a 'basket fund' on behalf of donors, and/or discrete projects supporting political party development or enhancing women's participation.

Post-conflict elections typically involve extremely high costs due to the number of activities that need to be carried out for the first time as well as the higher costs associated with securing the integrity of the vote and the safety of the voters. Tight deadlines, lack of adequate infrastructures and assets, and a volatile security environment can further drive up costs.

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
