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not intended to be read from cover to cover this book was designed instead to be a quick and useful reference for student young engineers and experienced professionals alike it provides guidelines advice and technical information for preparing formal documents covering a range of report formats e g assessment laboratory and progress reports this concise no nonsense guide

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how can libraries ensure that patrons from all socio economic and ethnic backgrounds have access to advanced technology training and hardware everyone knows libraries provide access to computers and the internet for day to day use but many libraries have gone beyond those basic services makerspaces and advanced tech training are often not equitably distributed between differing communities the digital divide is still very real and by not providing equal access to maker spaces and other similar services libraries may be unintentionally contributing to that divide this book examines how the unequal distribution of resources between communities can limit access to emerging technologies chapters from librarians across the country give real world examples of libraries going the extra mile to bring more than just email access to their communities regardless of economic status or geographic distribution you'll find practical plans put forward by working professionals who have sought pragmatic solutions to issues of digital literacy access is a through line in this work as people look at the larger ideas of access as inclusive of training diverse technologies and the time and space to make genuine growth in tech literacy chapters include working with immigrants low cost laptops for library use deep dives into the underpinnings of the maker movement and developing community focused technology training after reading this book librarians should have practical ideas to address the issue of equity in access to emerging technologies in their own communities

i am very pleased to write these few brief paragraphs introducing this book and would like to take this opportunity to attempt to set the toolpack project in an appropriate historical context the toolpack project must be considered to have actually begun in the fall of 1978 when prof webb c miller at a meeting at jet propulsion laboratories in pasadena california suggested that there be a large scale project called toolpack aimed at pulling together a comprehensive collection of mathematical software development tools it was suggested that the project follow the pattern of other pack projects such as eispac linpack and funpack which had assembled and systematized comprehensive collections of mathematical software in such areas as eigenvalue computation linear equation solution and special function approximation from the fact that the toolpack project would differ significantly from beginning it was recognized these earlier pack projects in that it was attempting to assemble and systematize software in an area which was not well established and understood thus it was not clear how to organize and integrate the tools we were to collect into toolpack as a consequence toolpack became simultaneously a research project and a development project the research was aimed at determining effective strategies for large scale integration of large scale software tools and the development project was aimed

at implementing these strategies and using them to put high quality tools at the disposal of working mathematical software writers

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
