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the essays in this volume aim to contribute to the newly developing academic subject of biblical spirituality it is prompted by the belief that although the christian tradition has always nurtured an emphasis on spirituality rooted in the bible and its interpretation few biblical scholars until recently have pursued their work by making connections with either this religious tradition or present day interest in the broader phenomenon of spirituality spiritual interpretation has overlaps with theological interpretation but is distinctive because of its focus on the wisdom of lived experience and practice the essays therefore attempt from within the context of the academy responsible readings of scripture that have as a major focus the study of how particular texts might contribute to a spirituality in which individual and communal flourishing is a major feature the essays began as papers produced for an international symposium on the bible and spirituality in may 2012 hosted by the centre for the study of the bible and spirituality in the school of humanities at the university of gloucestershire

a clear guide to help readers understand why they can trust the bible we are often told we can no longer assume that the bible is trustworthy from social media memes to popular scholarship so many attacks have been launched on the believability of scripture that many have serious questions about the bible such as did jesus actually live did the biblical writers invent their message how can we trust the gospels since they were written so long after jesus lived how can we believe a bible that is full of internal contradictions with itself and external contradictions with science aren't the biblical manuscripts we have just copies of copies that are so corrupted they don't represent what the original authors wrote why should we believe the books that are in the bible since many good ones were left out like the gospel of thomas why trust the bible when there are so many contradictory translations of it if you find yourself unable to answer questions such as these but wanting to why i trust the bible by eminent bible scholar and translator william mounce is for you these questions and more are discussed and answered in a reasoned definitive and winsome way the truth is that the bible is better attested and more defensible today than it ever has been questions about the bible are perhaps the most significant challenge confronting christian faith today but they can be answered well and in a way which will lead to a deeper appreciation for the truth and ongoing relevance of the bible

anthony hoekema brings to the study of biblical prophecy and eschatology a maturity that is rare among contemporary works on the subject free of sensationalism he evinces a reverence for the scriptures and a

measured scholarship one of the best studies on eschatology available christianity today

first published in 1990 the bible as rhetoric explores the ways in which the persuasive strategies employed in the biblical texts relate both positively and negatively to their preoccupations with religious and historical truth the book contains pioneering interdisciplinary papers that clarify what is at issue in the apparently competing claims that the bible should be read as literature and as scripture uniquely the volume brings together philosophers literary critics biblical scholars theologians and historians of ideas who combine the best biblical and historical scholarship with a range of contemporary approaches to the study of texts from the deconstructive and the feminist through the wittgensteinian to those of the heirs of the tradition of practical criticism the volume is of importance both to those interested in the applications of contemporary literary theory and to all those concerned with the relation between religious and secular readings of the bible
